



## **Improving Care Delivery**



### Costs for people to receive care on the Western Slope are 50+% higher than expected for commercially insured












# **Spot Analysis: Non-Emergent ED Usage**




Patient portion for this chronic condition medication has increased significantly over time which could negatively impact access and usage and outcomes






### **Outmigration Analysis by Provider and Service Category**
